Sick Policy

We are sure everyone is tired of hearing about our illness policy, but we have already had several staff and students get sick. Some even came down with Pneumonia and RSV. Please, please make sure you are following the illness policy. We do not want anyone to end up in the hospital. Please read the policy and follow it for the sake of everyone around you. If you have any question, feel free to come to us in the office.

Illness policy: The program provided at Good Samaritan Preschool requires that children are healthy and free of symptoms of illness. Children displaying symptoms of illness such as fever (100°F or above), diarrhea, vomiting, coughing, unidentified or contagious rash, lethargy, or green/yellow mucus discharge from nose or eyes should be kept home. Children are allowed to return to school after being symptom free and without medication for 24 hours.

If a child develops any of these symptoms while at school, parent(s) will immediately be called to take the child from the facility. The child must stay

home for at least one full school day after leaving the center. It is sometimes difficult to decide if your child is ill enough to be kept home from school. If you observe any of the symptoms listed above or feel your child needs medication to make it through the day, they should not be at school.

Remember: A child made irritable by illness is not only uncomfortable, but often requires more time and attention than teachers can provide. Since an especially needy child will decrease a teacher's ability to attend to the needs of the other children in the room, staff will use their discretion in determining whether a child feels well enough to participate at school.

Teachers will perform a daily morning health check when each child arrives at school. Parents should come to the room when dropping off children and stay long enough for the daily health check to be completed. At this time parents should notify the teacher of any medication given that morning (Tylenol, Benadryl, Dimetapp etc.). A child should not come to school if he or she is unable to function fully in routine activities, including going outside.


November News


Dino News
